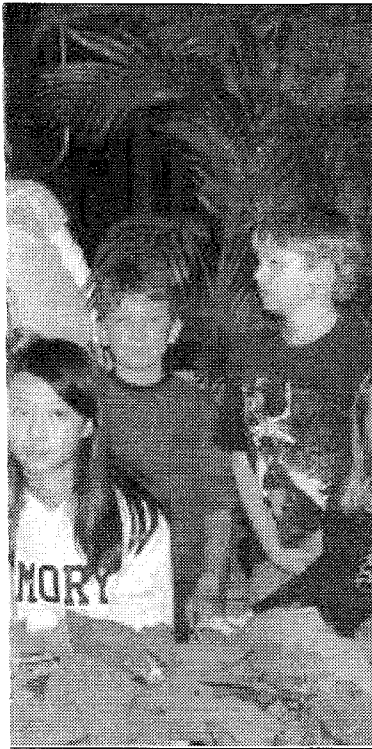

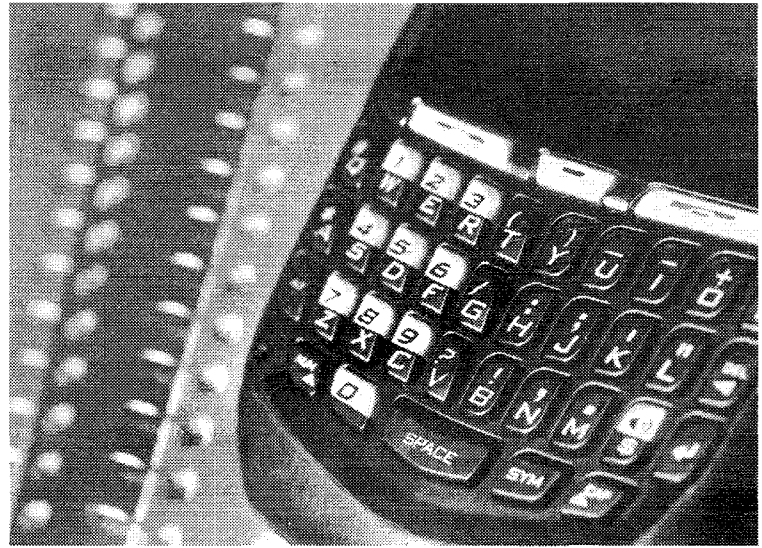
Dunwoody phone drive benefits women in need
