- WHY**
- The goal is to test at least 500 metro Atlantans with a Rapid Test that is simple to use and requires only 20 minutes to take. However, recent data underscore the need for increased testing among African American women:
- Of all the women living with AIDS in the United States, 60% are African American.
 - In 2002, HIV was among the leading causes of death for African American women overall, and was the number one cause of death among African American women ages 25-34.
 - 50% of all newly diagnosed HIV cases reside in Fulton and DeKalb counties.
 - 38% of Georgians newly diagnosed with aids between ages 35 and 44.
 - In Georgia, 79% of newly diagnosed HIV cases are Non-Hispanic African American and one-thirds of new female HIV and AIDS diagnoses in 2006 were in African American females.
 - Research shows that if people become aware that they are infected with HIV, they will modify their behaviors, thus reducing the possibility that they will spread the virus to others.
